Families who have adopted privately, publicly or internationally



- Iterating on practice—the people we are designing for are the path to innovative solutions
- Being willing to unleash your creative confidence
- Being fearless in the face of failure—get comfy that you won't get it right the first time
- Working towards consistency and not perfection

Through our intentional focus on diversity, equity, inclusion, and access we are 100% committed to making sure every kinship and adoptive family in Ohio who is looking for support will get it.

Inclusion, Diversity, Equity and Access (IDEA) Framework

- Conversational Agreements—identify group norms for all meetings
- IDEA Principles—Systems Analysis; Social Justice; Inclusion of Community Voice; Naming and Confronting Discrimination and Exclusion; Intersectionality; and our Sustained Commitment
- Center for the Study of Social Policy (CSSP) equity review
- Create an equity vision statement
- Culturally Responsive and Equitable Evaluation
- Train staff: Dare to Lead; Trauma Training; CSSP and Racial Equity Institute (REI) Groundwater training
- Integrate IDEA learnings into Key Performance Indicators (KPI's)
