Our Interest:

- Started with FFTA chapters and holding kinship summits in over 10 states
- > NC Chapter supported kinship work
- Utilizing Kinship Treatment Foster Care (KTFC) to transition out of higher levels of care
- Promoting public/private partnerships to support kin

North Carolina Pilot



Our Funding:

- The Duke Endowment supports our project and provided funding for 3 years
- Our work began in 2020 and the pilot phase concludes December 2022
- > The KTFC intervention is funded through NC Medicaid
