Kinship Care in OK – What is it?

- OK approves both traditional and kinship foster homes
- Kinship homes must meet the same approval requirements as traditional foster homes
 - 27 hours of pre-service training
 - Resource Family Assessment (home study), including all required documents
 - National fingerprint results
- Kids can be placed with the kinship caregiver while they work on meeting requirements

Kinship by the Numbers

- 41% of children in care are placed in a relative or non-relative kinship home
- The goal is to have kinship families approved within 60 days following placement
 - Most homes are approved between 60-90 days

Flexibility with Kinship

- Sleeping arrangements/space
- References
- Medical exam
- Required documents for approval (divorce decree, death certificate, DD-214)

Payments for Kinship

- Kinship Start-up Stipend (KSUS)
 - Equal to the amount of one month reimbursement for the child based on age
- Training stipends
 - \$375 when the family is enrolled in training
 - \$375 when the family completes training
- Monthly reimbursement begins once all approval requirements are met
